### **Acting Chairman's Report**

In many respects 2010/2011 has been a benign year. The Residents Association have not had any major controversial issues with which to confront the Authorities.

The perennial parking problems have been partly alleviated by the extension of yellow lines and more yellow line restrictions are proposed.

The Residents Parking Permit issue has not yet been finally resolved but Pound Hill North Residents have won a stay of execution.

The receipt of the Newsletter in May was well received and much credit is due to our hard working Secretary for assembling and collating the facts it contained.

The Committee welcomes the Council's installation of the Notice Board at Peterhouse Parade and it is gratifying that responsibility for maintaining it in a tidy and up-to-date condition is being undertaken by a public spirited member of the Residents Association.

Your Committee maintained a close working relationship with the Committee of The Friends of Worth Park and we have wholeheartedly supported the proposed restoration of these historic gardens.

We are grateful for the time given by Henry Smith MP and our Ward Councillors in dealing with the several queries we have raised with them.

The years ahead are probably not going to be free of controversy. The large expansion of Milton Mount School, the development of the N.E. Sector and the work on Gatwick Stream are all going to impact on the daily life of present residents.

Although your Committee is relatively small, the members are all dedicated and are ready to act if proposals by the various Authorities threaten to damage Pound Hill North as the most desirable residential part of Crawley.
