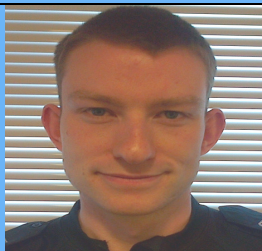

Over the past three months we have had held street briefings with the assistance of NHW and Police Cadets at both Milton Mount School and Pound Hill Infant School. Both children and adults took advantage of having their finger prints taken - which they then took home with them. Crime prevention advice was given and those attending took the opportunity to chat with the Police.

On the 22 June St Barnabas held their Summer Fair to which the police were invited. PCSO Bettina Long was assisted by Police Cadets, Special Constables and members of NHW; the police took along a police car as well as a police CCTV van for members of the public to view which was very popular indeed with the younger visitors of course.

We set up a gazebo and displayed crime prevention advice, alarms etc by NHW.

The Fire Service also attended and brought along a vehicle for visitors to view.

It was a fantastic event with lots of fun and the Pound Hill Policing Team would like to thank St Barnabas Church for their kind invite.

We are also delighted that both Banks Road and Crawley Lane have decided to join NHW and we are currently in the process of setting these schemes up. Please contact PCSO Bettina Long (whose details are on the reverse of this newsletter) if you would also like to set up a NHW scheme in your street.

- When you are reporting incidents please remember the registration number of the vehicle and where possible the make, model and colour, so the police can identify the vehicle concerned and make contact with the rider or driver.
- Sussex Police are committed to making the roads safer in Sussex and Operation Crackdown is proving to be a vital tool in tackling anti-social driving and getting abandoned vehicles off the roads.

Every report received through Operation Crackdown is viewed and a decision is made against a set of criteria on how best to deal with it. In the majority of cases a letter of advice is sent to the driver or rider.
